4.1 Zip release files

To build this library locally you'll need to install the `circuitpython-build-tools` package.

```
python3 -m venv .env
source .env/bin/activate
pip install circuitpython-build-tools
```

Once installed, make sure you are in the virtual environment:

```
source .env/bin/activate
```

Then run the build:

```
circuitpython-build-bundles --filename_prefix adafruit-circuitpython-am2320 --library_
↪location .
```

4.2 Sphinx documentation

Sphinx is used to build the documentation based on rST files and comments in the code. First, install dependencies (feel free to reuse the virtual environment from above):

```
python3 -m venv .env
source .env/bin/activate
pip install Sphinx sphinx-rtd-theme
```

Now, once you have the virtual environment activated:

```
cd docs
sphinx-build -E -W -b html . _build/html
```

This will output the documentation to `docs/_build/html`. Open the `index.html` in your browser to view them. It will also (due to `-W`) error out on any warning like Travis will. This is a good way to locally verify it will pass.

5.1 Simple test

Ensure your device works with this simple test.

5.2.1 Implementation Notes

Hardware:

- Adafruit AM2320 Temperature & Humidity Sensor (Product ID: 3721)

Software and Dependencies:

- **Adafruit CircuitPython firmware for the ESP8622 and M0-based boards:** <https://github.com/adafruit/circuitpython/releases>
- Adafruit's Bus Device library: https://github.com/adafruit/Adafruit_CircuitPython_BusDevice

class `adafruit_am2320.AM2320` (*i2c_bus*, *address=92*)

A driver for the AM2320 temperature and humidity sensor.

Parameters

- **`i2c_bus`** – The `busio.I2C` object to use. This is the only required parameter.
- **`address`** (*int*) – (optional) The I2C address of the device.

`relative_humidity`

The measured relative humidity in percent.

`temperature`

The measured temperature in celsius.
